
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PE and Sports News:

- Please pay in advance using ParentPay. Tickets must be purchased by the end of Monday 13th November. Please do not bring cash to the office.
- Numbered wristbands will be sent home on Wednesday 15th November. Children will need to wear their wristband to the disco.

Drop off:

- KS1 children must be dropped off at the main school doors (by the office).
- KS2 children must be dropped off at the bottom doors at the KS2 corridor – enter via the Pearn Road side gate.
- If you have children at both discos, collect KS1 children from the hall before queuing for the KS2 disco.

Collection:

- For both discos, this is via the main school doors (by the office). Please queue outside of the building and wait until you are invited into the hall.
- It is your responsibility to collect/arrange collection of your child at the end of the disco.



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Children making their own way home must bring a signed slip to the disco.

Phones:

- Mobile phones/devices/cameras are not allowed, please encourage children to leave their phones at home.
- If your child does need their phone, it must be brought in a clear plastic bag marked with their name and left on the door.

Please come along and join us – you're very welcome. We have had a few new faces recently and promise you it's not daunting to come along; you'll feel part of the fabric in no time!


